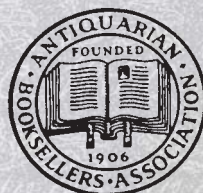

Happy New Year! This is the third year running for this style of catalogue.. After all the spending excesses of the Christmas season, the last thing you need is a catalogue full of expensive rarities. So, here is a list of over 200 books, giving only title and author. There are no pictures, no online listings, no shopping cart system or other automated luxuries. But the result is these books can be offered at very low cost. Condition varies. Many have dustjackets, many do not, a few are ex-library.

As most of you know, many books can now be found at low cost at various online book sites, but in almost every case, shipping is \$4.00-\$5.00 or more per book. The books on this list and the quantity prices include

So compared to buying books one at a time elsewhere, it is like getting the books for free here.

The quantity discount schedule is as follows:

The different categories can be combined for quantity discount. So an order for 10 hardbacks, 8 trade paperbacks, and 2 paperbacks qualifies for the **20+ price** on all of them. There are no descriptions of condition on these books. If I have multiple copies, the earliest order gets the best copy.

Please note that I have included a number of titles about Churchill from the 1990s that I have not offered before. And before you dismiss this list as all common books, please be aware that there are treasures to be found in the Section B and Section D books.

1. Orders can be placed by phone, email, or post. Email and phone are best as they still get through even if I am away.
2. The easiest is to simply send a list by number of all the books you would like. It will take me a little while to go through the stock and verify which are still available.
3. Payment can be by check in US\$, Sterling cheque, or by Visa or Mastercard. For credit card orders, please provide card number, expiry date, and the 3 digit security code found on the back by the signature.

The next catalogue will be new acquisitions, mostly ephemera.

Books about Churchill

- 1 (Martin, Hugh). BATTLE: The Life Story of Winston S. Churchill, Prime Minister. This cheap wartime reprint is smaller than the 1932 original at 5 x 7.5 ins, and at 152 pages has been heavily abridged, although a new chapter on the events of 1940 is added.
- 2 (Guedella, Philip). Mr. Churchill. Paperback issue of this popular wartime bio.
- 3 (Thomson, Malcolm). The Life and Times of Winston Churchill. This revised edition adds 32 more pages for a total of 352. Endpapers now plain.
- 4 (Thomson, Malcolm). The Life and Times of Winston Churchill. This is the 1965 revised edition with bright red hardcovers.
- 5 (Broad, Lewis). Winston Churchill 1874-1945. This is 1946 edition in black cloth.
- 6 (Kraus, René). Winston Churchill A Biography. The author is a European with much firsthand experience of Churchill and Britain, although living in USA. A full length bio illustrated with 16 photos. Bound in red cloth, 366 pages, index.
- 7 (Ephesian) Life of Winston Churchill. This 1936 reprint identifies the author as being C. Bechofer Roberts.
- 8 (Cunningham-Reid, Capt.) Besides Churchill-Who? A small book of 127 pages bound in blue-green cloth covered softcovers. The author is an MP who is highly critical of Chamberlain and the appeasers, and the establishment in general. Scarce title.
- 9 (Paneth, Philip). The Prime Minister, Winston S. Churchill, as Seen by his Enemies and Friends. An elusive wartime title, printed on thin paper. 124 pages, 5.5 x 8.5 inches, illustrated with cartoons from around the world. Hardcover in black cloth, gutterbreak at title page.
- 10 (Allary, Jean). Un Petit-fils de Marlborough: Winston Churchill. This French language biography is 256 pages, bound in illustrated card covers.
- 11 (Moir, Phyllis) I was Winston Churchill's Private Secretary. The first of the personal recollections by members of staff, and an interesting first hand account of Churchill's working habits. Always in demand, now hard to find. 219 pages, bound in bright red.
- 12 King and Country, Selections from British war Speeches 1939-1940. This small 64 page hardcover book Includes 8 Churchill selections, including one on the return of HMS Exeter that does not appear in Into Battle.
- 13 (Broad, Lewis) Winston Churchill, Spanish translation published 1944 in Madrid, blue cloth hardcover, 577 pages.
- 14 (Broad, Lewis) Winston Churchill, French translation, published 1943 in Neuchatel in Switzerland. Card covers
- 15 (Eade, Charles.) Churchill by His Contemporaries. A very useful collection of essays, belongs in every Churchill library. Forty essays on Churchill by both friends and foes. First editions are large impressive books, 6 x 9 inches, 528 pages, index, illustrations.
- 16 (Bocca, Geoffrey). The Adventurous Life of Winston Churchill. A wide 7 x 9.5 in book, well illustrated, with Low cartoon on endpapers. 256 pages, seems aimed at high school readers.
- 17 (Marsh, John). The Young Winston Churchill. Hardcover in blue cloth, first order gets a DJ.
- 18 (Boas, Guy) Sir Winston Churchill, Selections from his Writings and Speeches. This book publishes an interesting selection of extracts from Churchill books and speeches, running from My Early Life through his 80th Birthday speech in 1954. 278 pages, extensive notes. Bound in lithographed cloth boards
- 19 (Lockhart, J.G.). Winston Churchill. A small biography of 158 pages by a Secretary of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association so the emphasis is politics.

- 20 (Cowles, Virginia). Winston Churchill: The Era and the Man. A good 1950's biography. 378 pages, 21 illustrations, index. The author, though a Labour Party member, writes a generally favourable story.
- 21 (Marchant, Sir James (editor)). Winston Spencer Churchill Servant of Crown and Commonwealth. A superb collection of tributes to Churchill on his 80th Birthday from a list of colleagues which reads like Who's Who; including Eden, Menzies, Baruch, Attlee, The Aga Khan, Bonham-Carter, etc. Essential, and fortunately common, despite the Internet sharks who call it rare. Some copies came with a wraparound 80th Birthday card with a detachable postcard to be sent to Churchill, such as this copy.
- 22 (Taylor, Robert Lewis). Winston Churchill, An Informal Study of Greatness. A popular biography, illustrated with a few photos, with a slightly different tack. Much is based on interviews with colleagues. Very common, so belongs in every library.
- 23 (Frankfurter, Alfred M. (ed)). Winston Churchill the Painter. Subtitled: Catalogue of an Exhibition of Paintings of the Rt. Hon. Winston S. Churchill. 7 x 10 ins, 48 pages, includes 35 plates of Churchill paintings, many in colour.
- 24 (Hassall, Christopher) Edward Marsh, A Biography. A 732 page bio of Marsh, Patron of the Arts, and Churchill's PPS back in the pre war days.
- 25 (Willans, Geoffrey & Charles Roetter) The Wit of Winston Churchill. A collection of witty quotes from Churchill in the House, including some great exchanges with his rivals Bevan and Shinwell. 106 pages, illustrated by cartoons. Good fun. Recommended.
- 26 (Moorehead, Alan) Winston Churchill in Trial and Triumph. This brief biography of 117 pages by a successful author is considerably scarcer than the expanded versions he issued later. Attractive red and yellow dustwrapper.
- 27 (Tabori, Paul). Bei Whisky und Zigarre. A small book of Churchill anecdotes and cartoons. Text in German. 64 pages, laminated boards.
- 28 (Czarnomski, F.B.) The Wisdom of Winston Churchill. Without doubt the best collection of Churchill quotes and quips. Especially useful as the quotes are arranged by topic, and give sources. 427 pages. Long out of print, demand far exceeds supply. Woods Da20.
- 29 (Urquhart, Fred) W.S.C. A Cartoon Biography. By far the best book on Churchill in cartoons. 242 pages of cartoons from 1900-1954, with index by source and artist. Highly Recommended.
- 30 (Stewart, Herbert Leslie). Sir Winston Churchill as Writer and Speaker. Not just another bio; this small book of 161 pages looks at Churchill as historian, author, and orator. Originally published in Canada with the title Winged Words, the author is a Professor at Dalhousie University.
- 31 (Thompson, Carlos). The Assassination of Winston Churchill. Not what you think from the title. Debunks the claim about Churchill being involved in Gen. Sikorski's death in the play by Hochhuth. It turns out a certain Mr. Irving was involved....
- 32 (De Mendelssohn, Peter). The Age of Churchill, Heritage and Adventure 1874-1911. Originally intended to be the first volume of a three volume biography, only this one was ever published. A detailed bio, well documented with notes and references, 627 pages, a large thick book.
- 33 (Feis, Herbert) Between War and Peace: The Potsdam Conference.
- 34 (Graubard, Stephen R.) Burke Disraeli and Churchill, The Politics of Perseverance. Another scarce title from a University Press, which generally sold in small numbers mostly to libraries. The author draws parallels between these 3 great leaders- writers, critics and determined. A scarce title, missing from many collections. 262 pages, index, bibliography.
- 35 (Hyam, Ronald) Elgin & Churchill at the Colonial Office 1905-1908. An important and scarce book. A study of the colonial policy of the Liberal Government with Lord Elgin (as in marbles) the Colonial Secretary and Churchill in his first cabinet job as Under Secretary. The author had exclusive and unrestricted access to the

Elgin papers. 574 pages, index, photos, detailed footnotes at foot of pages. Bound in plain navy cloth gilt, but with a distinctive dustwrapper in medium purple with a cartoon of Churchill on the frieze of the Parthenon. Recommended, but truly scarce and seldom offered.

- 36 (Thompson, R.W.). *The Yankee Marlborough*. The author's objective was not a biography, but an interpretation. Critical at times, but consider the source. This is the same author who later wrote *Churchill and Morton*, based on Morton's diaries, to which he had full access. Do not confuse this Thompson with either the detective sergeant bodyguard, or the Naval Commander personal assistant. A review in FH 27 notes that it concentrates on Churchill's flaws, but still recommends the book, especially for the look at the WSC vs FDR battle re Russia at the end of the war. 363 pages, index, bibliography.
- 37 (Young, Kenneth) *Churchill and Beaverbrook*. Churchill first met Max in 1910, the start of a long, and at times, stormy, relationship. This well documented book is the standard work on the subject and belongs in every Churchillian library. 349 pages, index, notes, photos.
- 38 (Higgins, Trumbull) *Winston Churchill and the Dardanelles*. An important book on this aspect of Churchill's career. Critical but well researched and documented with extensive notes. 239 pages, index, map endpapers.
- 39 (Harrity, Richard and Ralph G. Martin) *Man of the Century Churchill*. A good photo-biography printed on coated paper. 7.5 x 10 ins, 247 pages. Uncommon.
- 40 (Moran, Lord) *Churchill, Taken from the Diaries of Lord Moran. The Struggle for Survival 1940-1965*. An important book, based on the diaries of Churchill's personal physician. Significant primary source, but much controversy over what Lord Moran said, and if he should have said it.
- 41 (Bonham-Carter, Violet). *Winston Churchill as I Knew Him*. The author is a daughter of H.H. Asquith and was a close friend of Churchill going way back. These memoirs are essential and fortunately inexpensive. 496 pages, index, photos.
- 42 Ferrier, Neil). *Churchill The Man of the Century*. A slim tall photo biography, very common, so no reason not to have one. 94 pages, gravure printing.
- 43 *Memorial Addresses in the Congress of the United States and Tributes in Eulogy of Sir Winston Churchill*. Publishes the various statements made in Congress upon Churchill's death, and also a number of tributes from various other sources inserted in the record by their representatives. It also reprints details of Churchill's honorary U.S. citizenship. Ten copies were given to each Congressman and 15 to each Senator, so the supply is limited. very worthwhile. Bound in black cloth with gilt stamping.
- 44 (Gardner, Brian) *Churchill in Power, as Seen by His Contemporaries*. This is the US title for *Churchill in His Time*. Churchill is now regarded as a hero of the war, but not so at the time, when there were many who had negative things to say. This book tells what they were saying about him during the war. 349 pages, index, notes on sources.
- 45 (Broad, Lewis) *Winston Churchill The Years of Preparation*. Part 1 of a 2 volume set. The ultimate version of the long running and much revised bio by Broad.
- 46 (Clark, Ronald) *Sir Winston Churchill*. A volume from the series *Living Biographies for Young People*. 128 pages, index, a few photos, bound in orange cloth stamped in silver.
- 47 (Farrell, Alan). *Sir Winston Churchill*. A modest juvenile biography from the *Men and Events* series. 142 pages, index, photos, bound in dark blue cloth stamped in yellow.
- 48 (Nathan, Adele Gutman) *Churchill's England. The Story of Life in England as Churchill Knew it*. An illustrated juvenile biography, 9 x 10 ins, 94 pages, photo endpapers, text in two columns. Uncommon.
- 49 (Broad, Lewis) *The War That Churchill Waged*. By the most prolific of Churchill biographers at the time, this volume concentrates on Churchill and his direction of the war. There is special emphasis on the split between Churchill and Roosevelt over Stalin and Russia. Clearly pro-Churchill. 472 pp, index, notes.

- 50 (Le Vien, Jack and John Lord). *The Valiant Years*. More an inspirational history of WW2 with a strong Churchill tie, based on the TV series of the same name. Uncommon and worthwhile.
- 51 (Reynolds, Quentin) *All About Winston Churchill*. A juvenile title by the famed war correspondent. 159 pages, photos, index. English edition in blue cloth
- 52 (Smith, N.D.) *Winston Churchill*. Quality juvenile bio, illustrated with cartoons and photos, 108 pages, index, square format 6.75 x 8 inches. Bound in dark olive cloth, bright blue dj.
- 53 Albert Camus-Winston Churchill. A volume from a series on Nobel Prize winners, originally published in French in 1966. The section on Churchill includes the Presentation Address, the Acceptance Speech (Lady Churchill), excerpts from *The Island race* and *My Early Life*, an essay on his Life and Work, and details on the 1953 prize. Bound in blue leather(ish) material, elaborately stamped in gold and blind.
- 54 (Thompson, R.W.) *Churchill and the Montgomery Myth*. The author's theme is that in 1942 Churchill needed a PR victory, and Montgomery was just the kind of eccentric character to provide the needed hero. Like most of this author's books, the terms critical or revisionist may be applicable.
- 55 (Adler, Bill) *The Churchill Wit*. A compilation of quotes, many witty, with lots of photos mixed. 86 pages, not all quotes with sources.
- 56 (Halle, Kay) *The Irrepressible Churchill*. A superb collection of quotes, especially humorous ones. All with a few words on the context and sources, although many are listed as ear-witness. 372 pages, index. The American edition is much larger at 7 x 10 inches, so is preferred.
- 57 (Heath, F.W. -editor) *A Churchill Anthology*. Red hardcover, An excellent collection of Churchill's writings with meaty excerpts from major works and speeches. Illustrated with photos. 720 pages.
- 58 (Gilbert, Martin) *Winston Churchill*. New York, Dial Press, 1967. This American edition of Gilbert's first book on Churchill was published the following year. Now 112 pages in larger type with 8 pages of photos.
- 59 (Price, Dorothy (ed)). *Never Give In!*. The Challenging words of Winston Churchill, with an introductory Essay by Dwight D. Eisenhower. A small 52 page collection of Churchill quotes illustrated with pencil sketches by Joe Isom.
- 60 (Sykes, Adam & Iain Sproat). *The Wit of Sir Winston*. An enjoyable 96 pages of anecdotes and photos.
- 61 (Coombs, David). *Churchill His Paintings*. A large book cataloguing most of Churchill's paintings, 73 in colour, 429 in B/W. This has been the standard reference for many years, used by all the major auction houses.
- 62 (The editors of *Country Beautiful*). *A Man of Destiny Winston S. Churchill*. A sumptuous production in illustrated hard covers. Packs a lot into 98 pages- excerpts from books, colour plates of paintings, brief biography, tributes upon his death, etc.
- 63 Greenwald, Anatole (editor)). *Churchill The Life Triumphant. The Historical record of Ninety Years*. If you were taking one book on Churchill to a desert island, this would be it. Photos, quotes, list of decorations, details of funeral, more. 144 pages in lithographed boards.
- 64 (Towers, Frederick). *Sir Winston Churchill A Memorial*. A slim volume 8 x 11 inches, 62 pages, filled with gravure photos of Churchill's death and funeral. Probably the best book on the funeral.
- 65 (Pelling, Henry). *Winston Churchill*. Consistently rated one of the best single volume biographies. 724 pages, index, notes, some photos.
- 66 (Payne, Robert) *The Great man, A Portrait of Winston Churchill*. A substantial one volume biography of 416 pages, definitely critical. Index, notes, chronology, family tree endpapers, photos, attractive red and black on white dj.
- 67 (Mee, Charles L.) *Meeting at Potsdam*. Looks at the final summit of the war in Potsdam, just before Churchill lost Office. 370 pages, index, photos, map endpapers.

- 68 (Longford, Elizabeth). Winston Churchill. Excellent photo-biography, 8.5 x 11 inches, 224 pages, index. Commissioned and authorized by the Winston Churchill Foundation.
- 69 (Thompson, R.W.). Generalissimo Churchill. This book is critical of Churchill's role in directing the military end of the war. 252 pages, index, bibliography, photos, map endpapers.
- 70 (Stansky, Peter) Churchill, A profile. A series of profiles on Churchill by a number of respected writers, including some balancing views by opponents. A much requested book, with a wholly inadequate supply. 270 pages.
- 71 (Lewin, Ronald). Churchill as Warlord. A respected analysis of Churchill as military commander by a successful military biographer. Based on both published sources and personal interviews, the author details both the failures and successes, and ties this into a character analysis of Churchill. 283 pages, index, bibliography, photos.
- 72 (Frewin, Leslie) Immortal Jester. Subtitles: A Treasury of the Great Good Humour of Sir Winston Churchill 1874-1965. Compiled by Churchill's cousin (?). 138 pages of quips and quotes, arranged in broad categories, no sources given. A fun book, but elusive.
- 73 (Epstein Sam & Beryl) Winston Churchill Lion of Britain. A good juvenile title, 175 pages, index, photos. Bound in lithographed cloth with same picture on dj. Uncommon.
- 74 (Guillemot, Pierre) Churchill le dernier Victorien. Originally issued in card covers, this 2nd edition dark red hardcovers with leather spine. 252 pages, photos, decorative endpapers. (text in French)
- 75 (Lash, Joseph P.). Roosevelt and Churchill 1939-1941. Subtitled The Partnership that Saved the West. Lash is best known for his Pulitzer winning Eleanor and Franklin. A detailed study, 528 pages, index, references, section of photos, map endpapers.
- 76 (Day, David). Menzies and Churchill at War. Day's thesis that Menzies had aspirations to be PM in 1941 seems flawed. Redburn's review of this book is highly critical, still a subject that needs further research. 271 pages, index, notes, photos.
- 77 (Brendon, Piers). Winston Churchill A Brief Life. A modest length biography by the now keeper of the Churchill Archives. In reviews in 1984, Redburn harshly criticizes errors and lack of research, but Langworth likes the human side of Churchill the author brings out. 234 pages, 2 sections of photos.
- 78 (Garfield, Brian) The Paladin. Novel about Churchill's schoolboy spy.
- 79 (Morgan, Ted). Churchill 1874-1915. A comprehensive bio of the early part of Churchill's life, from schoolboy to the Dardanelles. 571 pages, index, photos, extensive notes to sources.
- 80 (Jones, Madeline). Churchill. A children's book from the series World Leaders in Context. 80 pages, 7.75 x 10 inches, brown cloth boards.
- 81 (Manchester, William) The Last Lion: Winston Spencer Churchill Visions of Glory 1874-1932. Hardcover, 973 pages, index, notes, extensive bibliography, a few photos.
- 82 (Hough, Richard). Former Naval Person. Subtitle Churchill and the Wars at Sea. Takes a different tack than the other books looking at the Naval Churchill, in that the author looks closely at how Roosevelt held a similar cabinet position as Churchill in 1915 as Asst. Secretary of the Navy, and how this common background helped them work together later. 244 pages, index, source notes, photos.
- 83 (Williams, Brian) Winston Churchill. A juvenile title from the Children of History series. 32 pp, index, illustrated in colour, glazed illustrated boards.
- 84 (Humes, James C.) Churchill Speaker of the Century. A good readable biography by this former presidential speech-writer. Appendices a real treat- one full of anecdotes, another lists many Churchill predictions and prophecies. 333 pages

- 85 (Kimball, Warren F.) Churchill and Roosevelt: The Complete Correspondence. Volume III Alliance Declining. This is the hardbound edition in cloth with dustwrapper. An invaluable reference, but hardly bedtime reading. (ex-lib)
- 86 (Pearson, John) Citadel of the Heart: Winston and the Churchill Dynasty. A Churchill family biography. Heavily criticised by Langworth in review in FH. It does some a bit like Kitty Kelly does the Churchills, but my wife just read it and loved it. The author does take cheap shots, and has some errors. 476 pages, index, photos.
- 87 (Hough, Richard) Winston & Clementine. The Triumphs and Tragedies of the Churchills. A lengthy bio of the Churchill's and their marriage. 528 pages, index, references. Reviewed in FH 67. Has its faults, but much good stuff, too.
- 88 (Charmley, John) Churchill The End of Glory. This revisionist work contends that Churchill should have sued for peace in 1940, rather than consuming the life wealth of the Empire
- 89 (Louis, William Roger) In the Name of God, Go!: Leo Amery and the British Empire in the Age of Churchill. Amery's famous demand for Chamberlain to go after all could see that appeasement had failed.
- 90 (Roberts, Andrew) Eminent Churchillians. The author publishes six of his essays on Churchill and colleagues. 354 pages.
- 91 (Kilzer, Louis C.) Churchill's Deception: The dark Secret that Destroyed Nazi Germany. Another conspiracy book, this one intimating that Churchill engineered Hitler's attack on Russia. 335 pages, notes, index, See highly critical review in FH 84.
- 92 (Kimball, Warren F.) Forged in War. A good book on the Churchill-Roosevelt partnership. 421 pages, notes, index. See review in FH 97.
- 93 (Shogan, Robert) Hard Bargain: How FDR Twisted Churchill's Arm, Evaded the Law, and Changed the Role of the American Presidency.
- 94 (Krockow, Christian Graf von) Churchill Man of the Century. This bio concentrates on Churchill's long time dislike of tyranny and dictatorship. Translated from the German original. 270 pages, index.
- 95 (Charmley, John) Churchill's Grand Alliance. The Anglo-American Special relationship 1940-57. The author looks at the growing dominance of America in this partnership, ending with Suez in 1957. 427 pages, photo, index. See lengthy review in FH 88 by Ashley Redburn.
- 96 (Blundell, Nigel) A Pictorial History of Winston Churchill. A large format photo biography of 96 pages. mediocre editorial content See critical review in FH 91.

Large (trade) Paperbacks about Churchill

- 100 (Pedraza, Howard) Winston Churchill Enoch Powell & the Nation. An interesting book which compares the philosophies of Churchill and Powell. The author argues that both had great faith in the nationhood of Britain. Scarce title, effectively a private publication.
- 101 (Kersaudy, François) Churchill and DeGaulle. A brilliant study of these two great friends (well, sometimes...) Reviewers praise the book. The book toasts DeGaulle. 476 pages, index, photos, notes.
- 102 (Colville, John) The Churchillians. Written by Churchill's Principal Private Secretary during the war and after, this book is based on first hand observations, not research in archives, so is a primary source. This title concentrates on Churchill's inner circle of associates. Chapter headings include: Early Friends, The Prof and Brendan, Beaverbrook, The Americans, The warriors, Degaulle, and others. In his review in FH 92, George Richard says Colville writes well, his perspective is from the inside and intimate view.

- 103 (Gilbert, Martin) Churchill A Photographic Portrait. Same content as the hardcover edition, but now a jumbo paperback in 7.5 x 9.5 inch card covers and thinner paper stock.
- 104 (Stansky, Peter) Churchill, A profile. A series of profiles on Churchill by a number of respected writers, including some balancing views by opponents. A much requested book, with a wholly inadequate supply. 270 pages.
- 105 (Wilson, Theodore A.) The First Summit, Roosevelt and Churchill at Placentia Bay 1941. A well researched and illustrated book on the Churchill-Roosevelt meeting at Placentia Bay in 1941. 344 pages, index, notes, bibliography. An important book.
- 106 (Humes, James C.) Churchill Speaker of the Century. A good readable biography by this former presidential speech-writer. Appendices a real treat- one full of anecdotes, another lists many Churchill predictions and prophecies. 333 pages
